TOPIC -----

Is the Apple HDI-30 SCSI Disk Adapter Cable for the Macintosh PowerBook 100 compatible with the Dayna EZ-10BASE T SCSI interface, and can I use this cable to connect the Dayna product to the PowerBook 100?

DISCUSSION -----

No. The Apple HDI-30 SCSI Disk Adapter Cable cannot be used as you describe. This cable is used to connect a PowerBook 100 to another Macintosh, which enables the PowerBook 100 to be used as an external hard drive on the other Macintosh system.

The Apple HDI-30 SCSI System Cable is used to connect any Macintosh PowerBook to an external SCSI device that conforms to SCSI standards. This cable is 19 inches long and has a standard 50-pin male SCSI connector. We don't have any specific compatibility information about the Dayna product at this time.
