How many internal SCSI devices can be installed in the Macintosh Quadra 800, 840av and Power Macintosh 8100 and 8500 series computers?

DISCUSSION -----

Because of space limitations, up to three internal SCSI devices can be placed into these computers. The primary variables are the type and capacity of drives you want.

- One 3.5-inch hard disk.
- One half-height 5.25-inch device such as an internal CD-ROM player.
- One full- height 3.5-inch device such as a removable cartridge drive, DAT drive, or another SCSI hard disk.
