TOPIC -----

This article describes the connectivity features of the LaserWriter Select 300 printer.

DISCUSSION -----

The LaserWriter Select 300 printer contains one communications port: a high-speed serial port for Macintosh connectivity. This printer has no LocalTalk port; it can, however, be shared over a network with the included GrayShare printer driver software.

The LaserWriter Select 300 is a QuickDraw printer and does not support any other type of printer control language. This printer is designed for use only with the Macintosh computer.

Serial Port  
-----

The serial port on the LaserWriter Select 300 is a special externally clocked high-speed serial port supporting baud rates up to 909 kbps. There are no switches or jumpers for configuring the serial port baud rate.
