TOPIC -----

I want to set up documents in At Ease so that when someone opens an existing document and modifies it, they are required to save it to floppy disk.

I have set "Require a floppy disk" in the At Ease control panel, but when someone opens the document, it can still be saved on the hard drive. What is the workaround?

Existing documents opened with At Ease can be saved to the hard disk even when the "Require a floppy disk" option is enabled. The option of saving to a floppy applies only to saving new documents.

To make At Ease require a floppy disk to save an existing document, make the document a "Stationery pad". Here's how:

- 1) In the Finder, select the document
- 2) Choose "Get Info" from the File Menu
- 3) Click "Stationery pad".

A document marked as Stationery pad will be opened as a new document containing all the information of the original. The student can then make modifications and save document. At Ease will require a floppy disk when saving the document because it is a new copy of the original document.
