TOPIC -----

I have a Macintosh with System 6.0.7 and KanjiTalk. Can I exchange documents with a Macintosh running 7.1 and using the Japanese Language Kit (WorldScript)?

DISCUSSION -----

There's no problem sharing documents between KanjiTalk systems (such as KanjiTalk system 6.0.7) and the Japanese Language Kit. The only requirement is to use KanjiTalk 7 compatible applications, since this helps ensure compatibility with the Japanese Language Kit. There's a list of localized applications tested with the Japanese Language Kit; it's included in the article "Japanese Language Kit: Overview (4/93)" in the Tech Info Library.

The other key factors are that both Macintosh computers have the same fonts installed and use the same applications. In the case of the KanjiTalk 6.0.7 system, the TrueType INIT is required when using a Kanji TrueType font. As in the US operating system, if different applications and/or fonts are used on the two Macintosh computers, there's the potential for incorrect document formatting and/or character mapping, respectively. Depending on the document contents and format, the specific application that created the document may be required to open it; however, generic files, such as text files, shouldn't have this problem.
