DISCUSSION -----

To access InfoServer, you need "InfoServer Client for Macintosh Media and Documentation Kit, part number QA-YSHAE-HB/CJV."

DEC's InfoServer is a network storage server that lets you share software and information. The InfoServer 150 delivers information to up to 100 clients, which can be Macintosh, DOS, RISC workstations, or VAX users. It supports 14 SCSI devices, including CD-ROM, hard disk, tape, and magneto-optical drives.
