

Retrospect: Bad StorageSet Header Error (8/93)

DISCUSSION -----

Each file in your StorageSet is preceded by a header that contains information such as its name and size. A bad StorageSet header error will appear if Retrospect reads a header that is obviously damaged or invalid.

What to do: If the error appears immediately while you are recreating a Catalog file, it means you forgot to tell Retrospect that the StorageSet was encrypted. If the error appears during backup or retrieving, it can indicate SCSI communication problems. See "SCSI problems" on page 180 of the Retrospect User's Guide for details.
