LaserWriter: Print Density Adjustment Utility (11/93)

TOPIC-----

The print density adjustments that are available on most of the LaserWriter printers do not seem to make much of a change in the toner density. Are there any other methods for altering the toner density in order to save toner when printing rough drafts?

DISCUSSION-----

The toner density adjustment on most of our LaserWriter products generate only slight visual changes. Depending on the type of documented being printed there may be no visible changes between the maximum and minimum density settings.

For more control over toner density there is a third-party product system extension called Toner Tuner $^{\mathbb{M}}$, from Working Software, Inc., that provides additional control of the toner density. Toner Tuner $^{\mathbb{M}}$ is a system extension that uses PostScript and QuickDraw commands to set the grayscale values for printed pages. The Toner Tuner $^{\mathbb{M}}$ software supports system 6 and 7, and all QuickDraw and PostScript based printers.
