TOPIC -----

How do I shutdown my Macintosh Performa when the mouse is missing or damaged?

DISCUSSION -----

If your Performa has the Shut Down desk accessory under the Apple Menu, you can use Command-key equivalents to perform a shut down. If you are using System 7.5, you can also use this procedure because it also provides the Shut Down desk accessory in the Apple menu.

Follow these steps:

- 1) Type Command-F, the Find command brings up the Find window.
- 2) Type "Shut Down" into the Find Window, and press the enter or return key.
- 3) When the "Apple Menu Items" window appears, Type Command-O (letter O), the Open command launches the Shut Down desk accessory and shuts down your computer.
