TOPIC -----

- 1) Is it possible to connect an Macintosh LC 475 or LC II to any Apple or Non Apple Token Ring Board (for example, Apple Token Ring 4/16 NB, or Token Ring NB/c cards)? In general is there a solution similar to the Ethernet NB card for the LC series?
- 2) In an installation with one Windows NT Server, PCs on Ethernet running Workgroup for Windows, one Power Macintosh on Ethernet, one Quadra 800 on Ethernet, and two LC III computers on LocalTalk (will not upgrade to Ethernet) -- I am looking for a general connectivity solution in the following areas:
- Is there an AppleTalk solution for a Windows NT Advanced Server?

DISCUSSION -----

- 1) Asanté makes a Token Ring card for the LC series of computers. Contact Asante to determine if their product fits your specific needs.
- 2) Windows NT Advanced Server includes Macintosh AFP support as a separately installed module. It is not installed during the standard Windows NT Server installation but can be added later from the original installation media. This Macintosh support includes AFP, AppleTalk routing and printing support.

The Macintosh support software is NOT included in the Windows NT Workstation software.
